OF THE TEACHING COUNCIL OF THE FACULTY OF ECONOMIC SCIENCES
OF THE UNIVERSITY OF WARSAW

on the exemption of students beginning in the academic year 2024/25
second-cycle studies in International Economics
from payment of the fee for educational services

Pursuant to § 7 s. 5 in connection with § 7 s. 2 p. 1 i 2 and with § 7 s. 1 of the Ordinance no 130 of the Rector of the University of Warsaw of 30 September 2019 on the principles for collection, as well as terms and procedure for exemption from the fees for educational services at the University of Warsaw (UW Monitor, item 306, as amended), in conjunction with § 34, s. 2 and 3 of Resolution No. 441 of the Senate of the University of Warsaw on the adoption of the Rules of Study at the University of Warsaw (UW Monitor 2019, item 186), it is resolved as follows:

§ 1

1. Students who have been admitted to a second-cycle degree programme in International Economics may apply for a full tuition fee waiver for the first year of study.
2. It is possible to extend the tuition fee discount to the second year of study provided that all subjects included in the first stage study programme are passed on time.
3. Only students who are citizens of Member States of the European Union, the Swiss Confederation or a Member State of the European Free Trade Agreement (EFTA) - Parties to the Agreement on the European Economic Area - may apply for the tuition fee exemption.

§ 2

1. The ranking list of students admitted in the first year of study is the basis for obtaining a discount in the first year of study.
2. The ranking list is created after the end of recruitment for the academic year and includes students admitted in all recruitment rounds.
3. The ranking list is created based on the following formula:

$$P \cdot \sum_{i=1}^N LG_i \cdot O_i$$

where:

P – denotes the conversion factor for having the status of a 'research university' (Ministry of Science and Higher Education 'Excellence Initiative - Research University' competition) by the institution awarding the diploma in the year of enrolment at the University of Warsaw for those who obtained a first-cycle degree in Poland or for the university's position in the Shanghai Ranking from 1 to 500 in the year of enrolment at the University of Warsaw. The conversion factor is 1 if none of the above conditions are met and 1.2 if at least one of the above conditions is met.

LG_i – number of hours per subject from the list of subjects listed below;

O_i – the grade obtained in a given subject (equivalent to the grade scale specified in the Rules of Study at the University of Warsaw).

4. The list of subjects that can be submitted to the formula includes:
 - a) economic subjects: microeconomics, macroeconomics;
 - b) Mathematics and tools subjects: mathematical analysis, algebra, mathematical statistics, probability calculus, econometrics;
 - c) core subjects (related in profile to the International Economics major): international exchange theory, macroeconomics of the open economy. Within this group of subjects, two additional mathematical or tools subjects not previously indicated may be indicated as equivalent.
5. Each subject from the list referred to in section 4 may be declared separately in any didactic form (lecture, classes, seminars). The equivalence of the submitted subject to those listed above is decided by the head of the educational unit.

§ 3

1. In order to apply for a tuition fee reduction, a relevant application must be submitted to the head of the educational unit in accordance with the procedure laid down in the Code of Administrative Procedure no later than 30 days before the commencement of the courses which are the subject of the application, unless the head of the educational unit stipulates a different deadline for submission of the application.
2. The decision to grant a discount in the first year of study shall be made on the basis of the information provided by the applicant together with a statement of its factual accuracy.
3. A total discount on tuition fees in the first year of study will be granted to a maximum of 10 students, representing no more than 50% of all students entering the International Economics degree programme in that year.

§ 4

The resolution comes into force on the day of its adoption.
