The 10th conference in the After the Pandemic series, on THE RESILIENT SOCIETY, will be held online on March 3-4, 2022, with the keynote by Markus Brunnermeier (Princeton University, NBER, CEPR and CESifo). Markus is the Vice-President, American Finance Association, and the Director of the Bendheim Center for Finance at Princeton, where he organized a phenomenal webinar that inspired the conference series. His brief biography is below.

BACKGROUND: The Covid-19 pandemic exposed how unprepared our societies were to a major shock. The pandemic – induced disruptions are continuing and may lead to long – term scarring of workers and firms. Building a resilient society necessitates rethinking and redesign of financial markets, fiscal and monetary policy, management of high government debt, regulation, information management, global trade and finance, and climate change. Analysis of these challenges and how to deal with them will be the focus of the conference.

Keynote speaker bio: Markus Brunnermeier is Edwards S. Sanford Professor and director of Princeton's Bendheim Center for Finance. He is nonresident senior fellow at the Peterson Institute, a research associate at the NBER, CEPR, CESifo, the Luohan Academy, ABFER, a member of the Bellagio Group, Fellow of the Econometric Society and the recipient of the Bernácer Prize granted for outstanding contributions in the fields of macroeconomics and finance. His research focuses on international financial markets and the macroeconomy with special emphasis on bubbles, liquidity, financial and monetary price stability, and digital money. His recent book “The Resilient Society” won the Prize for the 2021 best business book in German and was listed among the best economics books by the Financial Times.
