The aim of this conference is to bring together academics, and policy-oriented economists by providing a forum for debate on economic policy issues relevant in the European context.

As the global economy continues to evolve, the nature of work and employment is undergoing significant transformations. This conference aims to explore the future landscape of labour markets, the impact of technological advancements, demographic shifts, and policy responses to these changes.

- Barriers to the labour mobility and employment in the EU Single Market
- Education, lifelong learning and skills development for the future workforce

Drafts should include: title of the paper, name(s) of the author(s), affiliation(s), corresponding author's email address, postal address, and telephone number. Please indicate if you are willing to act as a discussant.

Corresponding authors will be informed of the decision of the scientific committee by mid-April 2025.

Full papers should be received by email by 23 May 2025.
