The competition is open to persons who meet the requirements set in forth in the Act on Higher Education of July 20, 2018 (consolidated text: Journal of Laws 2018, item 1668, as amended)

The candidate should prove a scientific degree equivalent to PhD. The candidate must have a good knowledge of advanced quantitative methods. The candidate should have several years of experience in teaching quantitative subjects at basic and advanced level, including the use of specialised econometric software. A good command in Polish, as well as, in English is essential. The candidate is expected to provide (1) courses in advanced statistics and econometrics; (2) BA/MA seminars in micro-econometric modelling. The successful candidate is expected to conduct actively research in the field of econometric modelling. Any evidence of significant publications in this field would be an advantage.
